The word SCALE stand for Sussex Coproduction And Lived Experience.

The SCALE network will work with mental health services in West Sussex.



Coproduction is when support services staff work together with patients, their families, friends, carers, and the public to make mental health services better.



Lived Experience is when a person with poor mental health, works with mental health services. They talk about what life and support feels like for them, and for other people like them.



Mental health services help people with poor mental health. Mental health is being able to cope with the stresses of life, use our abilities, learn well and work well. Poor mental health is when we have problems with these.



If you have had poor mental health, or do now, and you live in West Sussex, then you can join the network to have your say about changes.



If you look after or help someone who has poor mental health or have in the past, and they live in West Sussex, then you can join the network to have your say about changes..



The network will work with people who fund mental health services in West Sussex, and the staff of those services.

The network and those people will work together to make our mental health support services better.




